A total of 1,123 internship ads were posted online from August 14, 2023, through September 13, 2023, for northeast Ohio. This was an increase of 170 ads from the previous reporting period and a decrease of 1,259 ads compared to the same time period a year ago. Seasonal variations can also affect the number of online job ads, so over the year it will affect the data in this report.
