Online Internship Postings in the Southeast JobsOhio Network

April 2025

A total of 144 internship ads were posted online from March 14, 2025, through April 13, 2025, for southeast Ohio. This was a decrease of six ads from the previous reporting and a decrease of 66 ads compared to the same time period a year ago. This data has not been seasonally adjusted. Sometimes seasonal adjustment is used to remove fluctuations in unemployment and labor force trends that normally occur with changes in the season. Seasonal variation in employment occurs for natural and institutional reasons, including reduced employment involving outdoor activities during winter, changes in labor force and unemployment levels with opening and closing of schools, and layoffs during the automobile model changeover period. Seasonal variations can also affect the number of online job ads, so over the year it will affect the data in this report.
