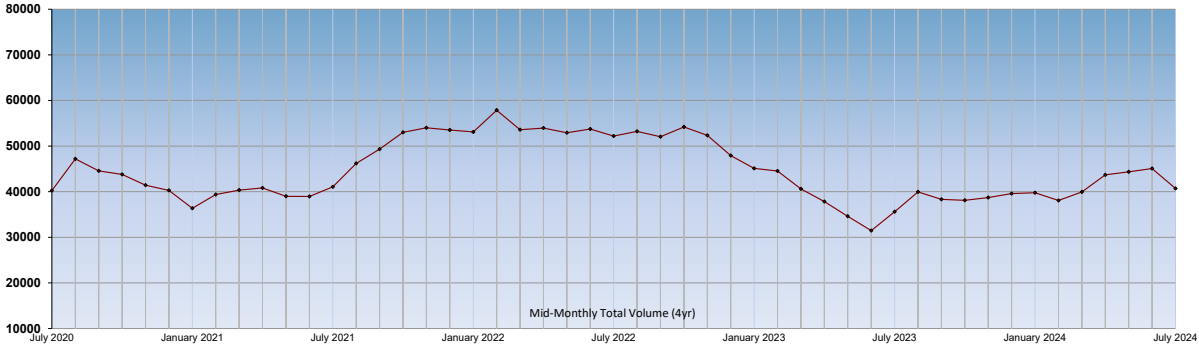




A total of 40,707 job openings were posted online from June 14, 2024, through July 13, 2024, for Delaware, Fairfield, Franklin, Knox, Licking, Logan, Madison, Marion, Morrow, Pickaway and Union counties. This was a decrease of 4,381 ads from the previous reporting period. Compared to the same time period a year ago, this reflects an increase of 5,107 ads. The graph below shows historical trends for ads posted in this area over the last several years.

EDITOR'S NOTE: This report is based on data provided by TalentNeuron Gartner™, a global research and advisory company. This data has not been seasonally adjusted. Sometimes seasonal adjustment is used to remove fluctuations in unemployment and labor force trends that normally occur with changes in the season. Seasonal variation in employment occurs for natural and institutional reasons, including reduced employment involving outdoor activities during winter, changes in labor force and unemployment levels with opening and closing of schools, and layoffs during the automobile model changeover period. Seasonal variations can also affect the number of online job ads, so over the year it will affect the data in this report.
